

ZJGSU LAW SCHOOL PROFESSORS AT THE FOURTH SESSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL
PROMINENT FORUM ON RULE OF LAW AND REFORM
HANGZHOU 10-11 NOVEMBER 2018



Over the weekend of 10-11 November 2018, three senior ZJGSU Law School professors participated in the fourth session of the International Prominent Forum on Rule of Law and Reform. The Vice-Dean of Zhejiang University Guanghua Law School, Professor ZHAO Jun, led the event, which was co-organised by the Collaborative Innovation Center of Judicial Civilization and the Academy of Social Science, with the support of the China Law Society. The forum was held in downtown Hangzhou beside the West Lake. The conference theme this year was 'Global Governance and International Law'.

From the Department of International Law, Professor GU Zuxue (Distinguished Professor, West Lake Scholar, Director of the Institute of International Law) and Professor Suzannah LINTON (Distinguished Professor) both spoke on the panel on Global Governance and International Law Theories.

Professor Gu's presentation addressed the topic, 'From International Governance to Global Governance: the Reform and Challenge-Coping of International Law'. Professor Linton's presentation addressed regional governance as illustrated by the European Union.

ZJGSU Law School was also represented by Distinguished Professor XU Xiangmin, who chaired the session on Global Governance and Domestic Law.

The event was opened by moderator JIA Yu, Secretary of the Party Commission, and Chief Procurator of Zhejiang Province. Opening addresses were given by the Vice-President of the China Law Society, ZHANG Mingqi, and the Executive Vice-President of Zhejiang University, REN Shaobo. Eminent professors from Peking University, Wuhan University, China University of Political Science and Law, Shanghai Jiaotong University, Xiamen University, Michigan University, Harvard University, Boston College of Law, the University of Central Florida and many other leading institutions also participated. In addition to the themes already mentioned, presenters engaged on topics within Global Governance and International Economic Law, Global Governance and Private International Law/Conflicts of Law, Global Governance of New Frontiers and New Developments in International Law etc.
