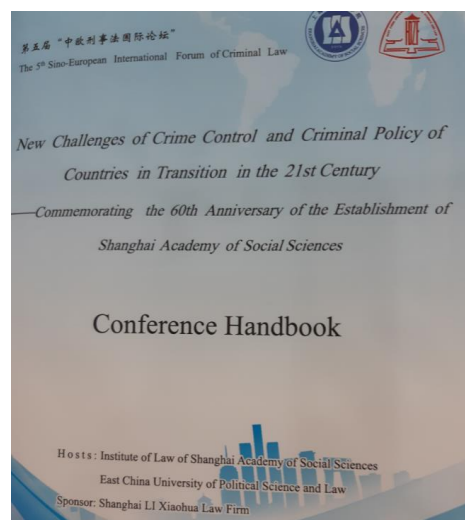


## 60<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF THE SHANGHAI ACADEMY OF SOCIAL SCIENCE AND THE 5<sup>TH</sup> SINO-EUROPEAN INTERNATIONAL FORUM OF CRIMINAL LAW



This year is the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the Shanghai Academy of Social Sciences. As part of the anniversary celebrations, the Institute of Law at the Academy and the East China University of Political Science and Law organised the 5<sup>th</sup> Sino-European International Forum of Criminal Law over 15-16 November 2018. The theme was 'New Challenges of Crime Control and Criminal Policy of Countries in Transition in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century'.

The Law School's Professor Suzannah Linton participated as a speaker, addressing the United Kingdom's transition out of the European Union with focus on criminal justice, and the particular challenges that it will face in police and judicial cooperation as a 'third party State'. Other participants included Professor Bifeng YE, Director of the Institute of Law of the Shanghai Academy of Social Sciences; Professor Qing YE, President of East China University of Political Science and Law; Professor He HUANG, the Dean of the National Prosecutors' College and President of the Chinese Society of Criminology; Professor Xu ZHANG, Professor of Law from Jilin University and the Vice-President of the Criminal Law Society of China; Professor Guoxiang SUN, Professor of the Law School of Nanjing University and President of the Criminal Law Society of Jiangsu Province; and Judge Kaijuan LUO, Head of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Criminal Division of the Shanghai High People's Court. International experts associated with the Research Center for European Criminal Law at the Institute of Law travelled from Hungary, Serbia, Romania, Slovenia and Croatia to participate in the event.
